Told in four parts from the perspective of four different characters it looks at how the way we remember things may not be exactly how they actually were. **BELMONT/Adult FIC SHI**

The investigation by J.M. Lee-Set in Japanese occupied Korea during WWII, this piece of historical fiction centers on a Japanese guard at a prison camp tasked with investigating the murder of one of his fellow guards. 


