Picture Books


Magee, Ann. Branches of Hope.

ADULT FICTION

Aslam, Nadeem. The Blind Man's Garden.

This novel follows the lives of two brothers in Afghanistan and Pakistan in the months after 9/11.

Abdullah, Shaila. Saffron Dreams.

The story of Arissa Illahi, a Pakistani woman whose husband is killed in the Twin towers. She faces prejudice as a Muslim woman in America as she struggles with raising a special needs child.

Delillo, Don. Falling Man.

A beautiful, cathartic, and heartbreaking novel on how 9/11 has shaped our depiction of the world. The story follows how the tragic event affects their lives.

Donahoe, Kathleen. The Ashes of Fiery Weather.

This novel brings to life seven women's lives in firefighting families. The tragedy of 9/11 is depicted by one of the first women firefighters.

Dubus, Andre. The Garden of Last Days.

Explosive events in a Florida Men's club depicts three people's lives in September of 2001.

Foer, Jonathan Safran. Extremely Loud And Incredibly Close.

Oskar is on a mission to find a mysterious key that belonged to his father who died in the World Trade Center. He comes in contact with survivors of every description that provide healing.

Hamid, Mohsin. The Reluctant Fundamentalist.

This book is an absorbing novel written from the perspective of Changez, a young Pakistani whose sympathies, despite his embrace of America, lie with the attackers.

Kalfus, Ken. A Disorder Peculiar to the Country.

A dark comedy about a couple intent on divorce who happily think the other has died in the 9/11 attacks.

McInerney, Jay. The Good Life.

A novel depicting the complex lives of a group of privileged New Yorkers who are forced to reassess their lives in the wake of the 9/11 attacks.

Moore, Lorrie. A Gate at the Stairs.

Depicts the coming of age of a 20 year old nanny after 9/11.

Rutherfurd, Edward. New York: the Novel.

An historical novel which intertwines the lives of black and white, rich and poor and the immigrant experience through 9/11.

Waldman, Amy. The Submission.

An anonymous winner for a memorial to victims of 9/11 is an American Muslim, much to the chagrin of the victims' families, politicians, and some of the jurors of the prize. The winner's fiercest defender, a member of the jury, must struggle with this poignant controversy.
